

One more time they wanted to demonstrate their love for Jesus. While walking, they asked themselves. "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?" The stone was large and heavy. As they approached the tomb at sunrise and looked up, they saw the rock was rolled away. They walked into the tomb. They were shocked. It was empty. An angelic figure told them, "Jesus is not here. He has risen. Go, tell His disciples, that He will be walking ahead of you and you will see Him."

The women were awe-struck. This was not just unexpected, but unfathomable. They had witnessed Jesus, the lover of their souls, nailed to the cross, bleeding, and dying. 

ST. PAUL'S COUNCIL MEETING MARCH 12, 2024

Because of the timing of the newsletter publication, these newsletter minutes are not the official, approved minutes. After the minutes have been approved at the next meeting, the final minutes are available upon request.

In Attendance: Dietmar Plajer, Sigrid Plajer as guest, Linda Turner (Finance report), Randy Tanner, Joanne Lauer, John Fischer, Jacob Koch, Carol Miller, Allen Wetzel, Lisa Krex, Kimmie Burkhart.

Excused: Jon Stante, Ellen Miller, Malcolm Derk.

Minutes of February Meeting: The February meeting minutes were approved as submitted.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dietmar is excited about the good work happening behind the scenes on the capital campaign and thanked the team. He is also excited about the church clean out being organized by the Property & Grounds committee and thanked Linda Turner, Dan Namet, and Sigrid for all their work with the clean out effort as well as others that have pitched in so far. "Entering the Passion of Jesus" is the theme of our Lenten season worship series.

Financial Report: A difference in accounting processes explained why some numbers were so different from the previous year. Linda Turner explained that dedicated funds are donations given above and beyond a regular offering, and the renovation donations for the capital campaign "Renewing St. Paul's" will be held as dedicated funds in the checking account. The February financial reports were sent out in advance of the meeting and were approved as presented.

New Council Member: Ellen Miller will fill Mary Dahlman's vacancy on council.

Strategic Planning: Fall 2024 planning - Pastor Dietmar said he is pondering and evaluating possibly having small group meetings at people's homes, and coffee before the service is up and running.

Associate Pastor: The position is posted and there will be a rubric that the committee will use to review the candidates. This will be a silent search for confidentiality reasons. Once the committee narrows down the search, a candidate will be presented to the congregation.

Renovation Project: A groundbreaking ceremony will be on Easter Sunday, March 31 after the 10:30 worship service. While the front sidewalk is under construction the first week after Easter, everyone entering the building will need to use the front door and access it via the Market Street side.

Spring Clean Out: Help is needed on three dates: Saturday, March 23 from 9-12 to move items to the Fellowship Hall; April 6 from 9-12 to move items to the garage; April 11 at 5:30 to move items to the curb. Pastor Dietmar will do a decommissioning of items we no longer use during the Palm Sunday service, and items will be available to pick up in the Fellowship Hall after the service for a small donation.

Safety Plan: Jacob Koch provided an update on the 'To Do' list. Front doors with crash bars are still being priced (around \$9,000 for repurposed doors and \$15,000 for new doors). He said they will wait until after the big renovation is over to see what the budget looks like before making any decision/recommendations. The second AED for the Fellowship Hall is on order, but it may take several months to get here due to supply chain issues.

Youth Leader Search: No update.

Nursery Coverage: We are still in need of someone to coordinate coverage.

Capital Campaign Committee: John Fischer reported that the committee has approved the materials that will be used and are discussing who will be doing what. Pastor Dietmar discovered broken stained glass windows from the original building during the clean out and hopes to repurpose the glass and make angels, crosses, etc. out of it. He and the committee will discuss the idea in more detail.

- People are needed to count money after the Sunday services. There is a rotation schedule and people will be trained. Please contact Rick Campbell if you are interested in helping.
- Amy Caron is stepping down as choir director. The Music Committee is looking for someone to take over the music ministry and is working on a new job description.

PASTOR'S REPORT - FEBRUARY 2024

Our St. Paul's Mission is to grow in faith, to worship God, to serve others, and to welcome all.

I'm excited about our "Renewing St. Paul's" Capital Campaign. We have a terrific group of people on the campaign team who are working very hard to help us raise \$140,000 for the big renovation that is to begin right after Easter. We already have \$160,000 of the overall \$300,000 which we need. We officially installed the campaign team in worship on February 11: Marty Blessing, Lois Bruno, John Fischer (Co-chair), Jean LeGros, Randy Tanner, and Chanin Wendling (Cochair). The team is preparing resources and a strategy. I hope and pray that you welcome these fine people as they will explain the need and scope of the renovation and invite you to join them in the campaign.

"Entering the Passion of Jesus" is the theme of our Lenten season worship series. We explore in depth the traditional scriptures of Holy Week and how they help us grow closer to Jesus. The series is based on a book with the same title by Amy-Jill Levine, a professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies. Better understanding the Jewishness of Jesus and his historical and cultural background makes the scriptures come alive and become more meaningful and applicable for our lives.

Again this year, I coordinated the "Ashes to Go" service at the Selinsgrove Commons together with clergy colleagues from our area ministerium on Ash Wednesday, February 14. It is an amazing experience to meet people of all walks of life. They shared worries, concerns, and prayer requests. Remembering our mortality helps us live more meaningfully and purposefully.

We are in full swing of a huge spring clean-out of all rooms and storage spaces at St. Paul's. We need an office for our future Associate Pastor. That required us to clean out the Music Room which created a domino effect. We uncovered some treasures and many items we do not need anymore. Everyone can help at the next cleanout event on March 23, 9a-12p. We will display all items of any value in the fellowship hall beginning with Palm Sunday, March 24, for members and friends to browse through and take what they want. We welcome donations for the Major Repair Fund.

l invested much time and energy in coordinating our ministries with our committees and service teams: Christian Education, Church Growth and Membership, Worship, Music, Property and Grounds, Stewardship and Finance, and Council.

I visited more members and friends of St. Paul's at Evangelical and Geisinger Hospitals in February than in other months. I met with two couples who want to get married at St. Paul's. Nettie Inch, the mother of Kathy (and Randy) Kreitzer and grandmother of Taleisha (and Matt) Burd passed away on February 8. I officiated at the Celebration of Life service for Nettie on February 16.

Thank you for your prayers, your witness, your giving, your service, and your faithfulness to God and to God's work through St. Paul's. I see God at work in and through you!
