

VACATION AND RETREAT - HOW WILL YOU MAKE ROOM AND TAKE TIME FOR GOD?

We have had plenty of green onions so far this spring and summer. The cucumber, tomato, squash, and pepper plants are producing. The eggplants are coming along nicely. It's growing season in the garden I planted again this year.

Veggies and grass need rain, sunshine, and nutrients to grow and produce. What does it take for you to grow in faith? Where and how do you feel close to God? How do you grow deeper roots, connecting to your Ground of Being? How do you open your heart and soul to the living God?

For me it takes two things: time and paying attention. Every morning I sit quietly meditating on our sofa with a cup of coffee. I record my dreams if I recollect them and reflect. This quiet time in the morning helps me just be, be present and relaxed. I read a devotion and reflect on its meaning. The morning is sacred time for me, in the sense of the Psalm 46:10, "Be still and know that I am God."

Where and how do you take time for yourself and for God? How do you pay attention to what is beyond the busyness, getting-things-done, and the distractions of the day? Summer is a great opportunity for making room and taking time for God and yourself. In its original sense, vacation means just that. Like a vacant lot or like vacating a place, vacation means, making room in space and time for what matters. Vacation is not just when you are off work and travel. Vacation is a place in your heart that you open up for God and for yourself.

Retreat is another word that is full of meaning. Retreat means stepping back and making room. I love going on retreats to learn and explore. Yet just like with a vacation, a "retreat" must not be a formal event. It can be simply a stepping back. Pausing for five to ten minutes and paying attention. Pay attention to your body, your feelings, your thoughts. Stepping back can give you a new perspective, when you see yourself from a distance, from outside yourself, like an outside observer would do.

We will be very intentional this fall in making room and taking time to connect with the living God. Our "Learning to Pray" worship series is an invitation for you to grow in faith, to open up, and to experience the living God. I ask you to join us in worship beginning with Kick Off Sunday, September 12 at 10:30 AM, and explore together with us how to fall in love with God all over again.

Whether you travel or stay at home, whether you are busy or relaxed, I invite you to join me in making room and taking time to encounter the living God during these coming days and weeks. In its original sense, take a retreat of 5-10 minutes a couple of times per day, and take a vacation - make room for God and for yourself in your heart. And pay attention to what is.

I hope and pray that you open up to the living God and retreat (step back) and vacate (make room and take time) for the living God to reach you.

When and how will you take time and pay attention in order to grow in faith?

If not before, I hope to see you on Kickoff Sunday!

ALL CHURCH PICNIC AND POOL PARTY



ST. PAUL'S MEDIA POLICY

We welcome and encourage media submissions by St. Paul's members. We are grateful for your participation in ministry and appreciate your contributions. At the same time, St. Paul's wants to comply with copyright rules and laws. Social and entertainment media platforms such as Facebook and YouTube have become more vigilant in protecting themselves by implementing and enforcing content policies. If St. Paul's does not comply, we risk an automated takedown of our online worship live stream on Facebook or suspension of our YouTube channel. If we are repeat offenders, we run the risk of our social media accounts being blocked and losing our ability to upload new content.

Before you begin working on your submission, you should understand what media you can use. We encourage you to use your own photos or videos, music, or text. It makes it more meaningful if you present your own creations. If you want to use materials that are available on the internet, you must have permission or a license to use the material.

- Generally, we cannot download YouTube videos or broadcast them from St. Paul's. If you have written permission from the owner and a file of the video sent directly to you, it can be used.
- Pictures and videos and other materials found through a simple Google search are likely protected by copyright and should not be used. There are a few sites that license content or make copyright-free content available for free use.
 St. Paul's also has a few subscriptions that could provide you with the material you want. The Tech Team is happy

to help and guide you towards places from where copyright-free media can be downloaded and used. We are here to assist you.

Here are a few guidelines for media to be projected on our screens:

- Text: No more than 4 lines of text in a large size sans serif font (Arial, Helvetica, etc.) so that it is easy to read from a distance.
- Pictures: Whenever possible, use landscape format (not portrait). Ideally, aspect ratio should be 16:9. Use the largest file size you can so the image will not look pixelated on the screens.
- PowerPoint: Our presentation software cannot show PowerPoint slides natively. The slides will be exported as images, so please do not use transitions and animations. If you need any help, the Tech Team is happy to assist.

All media submissions should be uploaded by Friday morning at 9 AM for the following Sunday so we can properly import the media and prepare for Sunday's worship service.

Thank you for your cooperation. We reserve the right to not use a submission if it does not follow this policy.

St. Paul's Council Meeting June 8, 2021

In Attendance: Sara Adams, Marty Blessing, Susan Bolig, Rick Campbell, Amy Caron, Bob Engel, Beverly Heinemann, Jack Lewis, Ivana Lluveras, Pastor Dietmar Plajer, Sigrid Plajer, Shane Sanders, Linda Turner, Kathy Ulrich.

Excused: Stacey Heinemann, Peggy Peeler.

Minutes: A motion was made by Linda Turner and seconded by Jack Lewis to approve the minutes from May 11th. The motion was approved.

Financial Report: Linda Turner reported. Bob Engel motioned to accept the financial report as read, Kathy Ulrich seconded, and the motion was approved.

Pastor's Report: Included in newsletter.

Unfinished Business & New Business

- **Newsletter Minutes:** It was decided to add a disclaimer that the newsletter version of the minutes are not the official, approved minutes, which are available upon request.
- Worship in person, via internet and by phone- How can we improve? Nothing will be changing for the time being. We will continue to hold service in-person, online and over the phone.
- COVID Safety measures: Continuation of the emergency meeting topics. Sigrid asked about the social distancing regulations for committee meetings over the summer, since the OWL works well. We trust the committee members to make their own choices and make the best decisions for themselves, we do not need to make the decision for them as Council. A motion was made by Shane to allow committees to meet in the church, hosting those who do not want to be in person on the OWL. The motion was seconded by Rick Campbell; the motion was approved by the Council. The Council discussed whether or not vaccinated people should be able to sing in church. That discussion will continue at the July meeting.
- **No children's message for the summer:** It was decided among those who manage and create the children's messages that a short, summer hiatus will take place to give presenters a break.
- Messy Church: Sigrid Plajer reported that June and July Messy Church will be held in the park as a whole church picnic. 61 people are currently signed up for the picnic in June. Sigrid encouraged people to sign up, but even if people decide at the last minute to join, they are more than welcome!
- Planning for the Fall Program Year: A 12-week series on Learning to Pray. Pastor Dietmar believes going back

to the basics and exploring when/how/why we pray would be a powerful series for the fall. How can we return God's friendship and closeness in like? When and how do we express gratitude, etc. Various kinds of prayer will be approached. Pastor Dietmar called on the Council and other members of the church to participate in the series in various ways, including sharing their favorite prayers for a little booklet that could be made, etc.

- Treasurer Position Report/Update: Marty Blessing reported. Last Thursday the personnel committee met with Courtney Hanes; she has the education and experience necessary for the position, having had this position previously for St. Paul's. She is currently available and would like the position. There were no other applicants, so they would like to offer her the position at \$19/hr and after 6 months and a review, it would go up to \$20/hr. Marty made the suggestion to offer her the position. Jack Lewis made the motion and Sara Adams seconded. The motion to offer the position to Courtney Hanes was approved by the Council.
- **Creation Care-Green Team leader:** Shane Sanders will give a tour of the community gardens during the All Church Picnic June 13.
- Land Acknowledgement: Shane Sanders reported. Shane had shared an example of a Land Acknowledgement that St. Paul's could potentially use, but the question of educating the congregation to have a better understanding of the how, when, and why. Instead of jumping right to creating a Land Acknowledgement, the idea of creating a specific committee, a "Living into Right Relations" group or similar body in the church that would be concerned with issues surrounding Aboriginal justice, right relations with marginalized communities and our history, and truth and reconciliation.
- **Pentecost Sunday on May 23**: Luncheon gathering with Rev. Dr. Carrie Call in fellowship hall, 13 attended, went well. Nice conversation with Carrie.
- Penn Central Conference Annual Meeting: Sat. June 12, 8:30am-2:30pm via Zoom. Need 2 representatives. Who will attend? Or who will ask members to participate? Pastor Dietmar will attend, and Marty Blessing volunteered to attend as well.
- The PA Department of Health has announced that it will lift the Mask Mandate for all PA residents on June 28th.
- Youth Leader Position: Christian Education working on

job description. A copy of the job description was sent to the Council ahead of time; some of the details of the description were discussed, but nothing was changed. Bob made a motion to approve the position description, and Marty seconded. The personnel committee will move forward with finding someone using that description.

Music committee-Youth Choir, Children's Choir, Bell Choir: The music committee is in a bit of a weird space when it comes to finding staff for the music program this fall. A meeting is necessary.

- Worship Committee Acolytes? Are there any youth who would be interested in being in that role? Maybe over the summer, get some kids in to do that, and then get on an actual schedule in the fall so we can do training, etc. We need one person who can take on that task – scheduling them and getting on that schedule.
- **Roof Repair Update Report:** Rick Campbell reported. Mike Proger will get the start date from the roofer when he has it. We have gotten quotes for various projects, including the

concrete work and windows. A few things got repaired in the Bridal Shop last week.

- Kick Off Sunday: Do we need to fill out a Borough form to block off the alley way? Sept. 12th will be Kick Off Sunday.
 Pastor Dietmar suggested that we have a designated team for planning that Sunday, so if anyone has any ideas for that team, or activities, we will pick that up next month.
- Visitation Ministry Coordinator: Search is ongoing.
- Fellowship Committee: Conversation is ongoing.
- What is St Paul's Vision: We will revisit in January 2022, using some of the comments from our conference minister's visit.

Minutes: A motion was made by Kathy Ulrich and seconded by Beverly Heinemann to approve the minutes from June 8th. The motion was approved.

Financial Report: Linda Turner reported. Courtney Hanes is our new treasurer and starting in August, she will start reporting to the Council. Bob Engel motioned to accept the financial report as read, conditionally including the changes that Linda said that Courtney will make on some errors present in the report. Rick Campbell seconded, and the motion was approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dietmar sent the report to the Council members ahead of time. He added that he is pleased to see that even though we're coming out of a pandemic, we have some new guests who are becoming regular attendees.

Unfinished Business & New Business

• The PA Department of Health has lifted the Mask Man-

date for all PA residents - Is it time to allow singing in church? People not comfortable can sit in the balcony as an option? We have been getting more guests/visitors. Is it time to open up more pews? Committees are having meetings at the church. How do we encourage people who are "on the fence" to return to worship in person? The Council discussed various options for when to start, with the committee voting unanimously to start singing on August first, with the condition that those who are unvaccinated do not sing, the balcony is a no-singing zone, and we inform the congregation this coming Friday. We will also remove some of the tape from the pews but leave a few so those who might not be as comfortable could choose to be in a pew behind one that is blocked off.

- Worship in person, via internet and by phone How can we improve? Things are still going well as a hybrid of both in-person and online, as well as on the phone. The live Facebook stream has a lower number of people watching live than we've had. They need a few more people who are able to run the sound/livestream it has been challenging to find people.
- Messy Church: "Jonah's Messy Olympics" with Picnic in the Park. Sigrid reported briefly that it was canceled due to the weather, so we have the program for one Messy Church ready to go.
- Service time for the fall: The Council decided unanimously to go switch to a 10:30 start for the fall.

- "How to Pray" Worship Series Planning for the Fall Program Year: What devotional do you use? When and how do you pray? What is one of your favorite prayers or scripture readings? Why? How do you care for yourself? Who is willing to share for 3-5 minutes in worship about their joy, wrestling, experiences with praying? Speaking about "dry times," about not knowing, of feeling stuck is meaningful and moving ("the gift of imperfection"). The key to this will be the personal sharing aspect, so Pastor Dietmar will need participants willing to share.
- **Penn Central Conference-June 12 Report: Marty Blessing and Pastor Dietmar.** Some of the big items: The budget was passed; the Executive Board will become smaller as 24 members was hard to get them all together.
- Youth Leader Position: How is the search going? Christian Education/Personnel Committee. There was one applicant, but not one that we would want to consider. We haven't really had any viable candidates at this point. Susan asked about potentially breaking that position up into multiple, smaller positions (Sunday School vs. Kids Group, etc.). Even if we aren't able to find someone, Pastor Dietmar would like to find a way to at least offer Sunday School during the service, after the Children's Message.
- Music committee Senior Choir, Youth Choir, Children's Choir, Bell Choir - what are their plans for the fall? Amy Caron reported: Senior Choir is the one choir that would be considered ready to go – they don't have an accompanist, but Jaime has offered to do that until they find someone. There is someone who is interested. For the Children's Choir, the parents are going to be polled as to the comfort level with unvaccinated children. Bell Choir director could be the same as the accompanist, but we will have to see. Youths are welcome to join the Senior Choir.
- **Kick Off Sunday:** Who will help plan/organize? There are some people who have ice cream makers. Shane will organize the painting of the Loaves & Fishes huts. It will basical-

ly be an extended Messy Church but including things that would attract members of the community. From 4-6pm would be ideal so that we can offer pizza & ice cream, but without taking so long.

- Confirmation Group for the Fall: Pastor Dietmar needs mentors and helpers. There are 8-9 youngsters who would be participating. There would be a combination of instruction and excursions/hands-on activities of belonging/serving, etc. Starting with Behavior, Belonging, then Believing. Pastor Dietmar needs the support of the parents and mentors.
- **Green Team New plans and ideas?** Should the Green Team fall under the umbrella of a "Living into Right Relations" committee? Shane will reach out to Darin Namminga about his thoughts on the creation of that committee.
- Worship Committee: Acolytes for September will need to be found by the Worship Committee, who will be meeting later in July.
- We received a card from Everyone's Playground thanking us for our contribution.
- Visitation Ministry Coordinator: Search is ongoing

- Vacation Pastor Dietmar: August 23 September 5. Linda Turner made a motion to approve Pastor Dietmar's vacation request. Bob Engel seconded, and the motion was approved.
- **Property and Grounds:** Rick Campbell reported, updating the Council on Roof Repair, refrigerator repair, and grease trap repair.

Pastor's Report - May 2021

Our St. Paul's Mission is to grow in faith, to worship God, to serve others, and to welcome all.

We observed our Music Appreciation Sunday with outstanding and moving music from soloists, ensembles, and instrumentalists on May 2. St. Paul's music is the best in town. I am very grateful to all musicians and participants in the ensembles. The virtual Senior Choir music and the recorded Bell Ensemble music with Maya Caron's leadership were highlights. All musicians on staff were recognized with gift certificates and handwritten notes.

Our worship service on Mother's Day, May 9, was meaningful through message and special presentations. Shane Sanders compiled a beautiful slideshow from the pictures that church members submitted, and the communion table was beautifully decorated by the Worship Team.

We recognized St. Paul's graduates in worship on May 16 with gifts and personal recognition. We expressed our gratitude to them and blessed them, wishing them Godspeed for their future journey. Again, the sanctuary was decorated to perfection for this occasion.

Pentecost Sunday was a highlight with the visit of our UCC Penn Central Conference Minister, Rev. Dr. Carrie Call, PhD. Rev. Call presented the message in worship and joined us for food and conversation in the fellowship hall following the service. We learned what makes for vital and vibrant congregations and great congregational and pastoral leadership.

I am deeply grateful to the Hospitality Team under Susan Bolig's leadership for arranging for the luncheon with the Conference Minister and for making the visitation and funeral for Dolly Klingler in the sanctuary run smoothly. To care and to offer extravagant hospitality is at the heart of who we are as Jesus' followers.

The Wednesday "Sunday School" group led by Raven Rudnitsky ended with a social gathering on May 26. This group used the Nooma video series by Rob Bell with additional monthly social justice videos as basis for their conversations. With up to 22 persons participating via Zoom, it has become a lifesaver for many who were longing for meaningful and caring conversation through our Covid-19 pandemic. My heartfelt gratitude goes to Raven for her leadership of this group.

The Property and Grounds team with Chair Michael Proger is preparing for several big renovation projects. The church roof needs to be replaced this summer as it was damaged by hail two years ago. Rust from railings busted concrete in various places, and sinking concrete slabs channel water toward the building instead of away. Windows on the office wing from 1959 are considered to be replaced with insulating ones and a more efficient furnace is in the talks. The next-door bridal store and the church garage need significant repair. I'm grateful to Mike Proger for his leadership and to all who support these efforts in repairing and updating our facility. My heartfelt gratitude goes to Lisa Krex, who again this season took on the care for our flower beds. Together with helpers, she does a phenomenal job!

I participated in an online Leadership Workshop with the Conference Minister of the UCC Penn South East Conference. I spoke at the Selinsgrove Baccalaureate Service for area High School graduates together with 4 colleagues in town.

Together with the family of Delia Ludwig (14) we wrestled about their suicide on May 11. I met several times with Delia's family and officiated the service on May 18. I met with the teenagers of the Youth Leadership Club at the REC to talk about their feelings and suicide prevention.

On May 3, I officiated the funeral for Dolly Klingler (91) who died peacefully at home on April 28. On May 29 I led the service for Kay Luckey, a cousin of Sylvia Knaur. On May 22, I officiated the wedding of Daria Kaminskyj and Ty Richland. Daria and Ty have been participating in St. Paul's ministries for the last year.

Thank you for your prayers, your witness, your giving, your service, and your faithfulness to God and to God's work through St. Paul's. You are the hands and heart of Jesus in action.

Jesus' emphasis is on how we can create a piece of heaven here on earth, how we participate in God's work right here and now in creating a better community and world for those who are hurting and suffering.

Messy Church with the Picnic in the Park was a great success with over 75 people participating. The theme was the Parable of the Talents, and the Messy Church team made it come alive through the crafts and activities. New people get a wonderful opportunity to connect with St. Paul's through our outdoor events. I am deeply grateful to all who made this afternoon possible!

Together with Marty Blessing, I participated in the virtual UCC Penn Central Conference Annual Meeting on Saturday, June 13. We have great conference leadership with the Rev. Dr. Carrie Call and the two associate conference ministers, Rev. Dr. Marisa Laviola (she is new to the conference) and Rev. Nora Foust. The Penn Central Conference is doing vital work as we are facing challenges together.

I participate in and help coordinate the ministries and work of St. Paul's Committees: Property and Grounds, Stewardship and Finance, Music, Christian Education, Church Growth and Membership, Worship, Personnel. Important and much needed repairs to our property need to happen. We are looking for a Youth Leader, new music staff, and a Visitation Ministry Coordinator.
