


OUR MISSION IS TO GROW IN FAITH, TO WORSHIP GOD, TO SERVE OTHERS, AND TO WELCOME ALL.











I have fond memories growing up hiking and backpack tenting in the Carpatian Mountains. Mostly, it was idyllic and delightful. But we also had some awful experiences. I remember being caught up in a storm above the tree line with gale force winds. Soaked to the bone we made our way down to a hut in the valley where we warmed up with hot soup and dried our clothes. On another occasion, we had a pack of sheep dogs attack us. They were ferocious, trained to scare off hungry bears who would come to take some sheep. We turned our backs toward each other and kept the dogs at a distance with our walking sticks. Finally, the shepherds noticed us and called the dogs off. What a sweet relief!

Our new summer worship series, "Quest: The Adventurous Traveler" invites us to explore new aspects of our lives and of our faith. Our Biblical stories describe Jesus as a traveling teacher and healer. The Gospels describe him saying, "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man does not have a place to lay his head on." When Jesus calls his disciples, "Come and follow me," he calls them to leave their place of comfort, their profession and family for God's purposes in service to others. Hebrews describes it as, "For here we have no lasting city, but we are looking for the city that is to come." As followers of Jesus, we are mission oriented, pushing forward, moving toward God's dream for us and for our community.

God calls Abraham and Sarah to leave their country, their home, and their family and move to a land that God will provide for them - the promised land. In the process, God promises to bless Abraham and Sarah and to make them a blessing for all nations. Abraham and Sarah had to pack up, let go, and move out of their familiar surroundings in following God's call. And so do we, as we listen to Jesus' call, "Come and follow me!" What holds you back? What is hard for you to let go? What keeps you from moving toward God's call for your life and for our community?

Like Abraham and Sarah, God is calling us to move toward the city on the hill, the promised land. God promises to guide and provide, to bless us to become a blessing to others. God is calling us to a better and promising future. A better world is possible! When the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was looking for the right words, Mahalia Jackson encouraged him, "Martin, tell them about the dream!" He took her up, improvising and adapting his speech to become the bold and amazing "I have a dream..." vision for our country and for the world.

This is God's dream for us, for our church and our community, God's beloved community where strangers become friends; where you are loved, valued, treasured, affirmed and celebrated for who you are; where you belong no matter your background, the color of

your skin, or your LGBTQ+ orientation; where no one goes hungry and everyone is fed, including with soul-food; where people are clothed with dignity and respect; where we care for each other and advocate for the vulnerable; where we laugh and cry together; where we are kin in our differences, God's diverse family!

What a bold and amazing vision for us at St. Paul's - to become God's beloved community. I'd love for us to expand our extravagant hospitality this fall with great coffee and treats before worship (this is part of our St. Paul's strategic plan). And I'd love to see some small Growth Groups form were we share our joys and concerns and grow together in faith, hope and love. Will you help with coffee hospitality before worship? Will you become part of a small group?

Will you get up and out of your comfort zone? Will you roll up your sleeves and lean in? Will you commit? We need you and we want you to help us become a better St. Paul's. I'm counting on you to participate wholeheartedly in the mission and ministries of St. Paul's as we build God's kingdom together.

Minutes of June Meeting: The June meeting minutes were approved as submitted.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dietmar sent his report out in advance of the meeting and there were no questions from Council.

Financial Report: The June Financial Reports were sent out in

advance of the meeting and were approved as submitted with no concerns.

Strategic Planning: Pastor Dietmar reported that Chris Jaegers is exploring with him plans for hospitality before and after the worship service targeting a start date in September.

Associate Pastor: Pastor Dietmar reported that he talked to Peggy Peeler and she is willing to chair the Search Committee. Council unanimously voted to approve Peggy as Chair. Pastor Dietmar stated that the UCC does provide support in our search.

United Church Funds: Linda Turner reported that the transfer from UC Funds to Northumberland National Bank has been completed and, once all paperwork has been signed, accounts will be set up and funded.

Property & Grounds: Allen Wetzel reported that, due to issues with his shoulder, he is no longer able to mow the cemetery and his son is unable to take over. Allen will contact Mike



Proger to determine next steps. Second installment payment to Strosser/Baer for \$3,000 came in and will be paid this week. No further updates.

Emergency Plan: Randy Tanner reported that he, Linda Turner and Jacob Koch walked through the building and came up with several items that need to be completed for the Emergency Plan.

Block Party, September 10th: Shane Sanders reported she was asking Jack Lewis and Allen Wetzel to cook hot dogs. Randy Tanner has agreed to run Bingo and Kim Haizlett and possibly Barbie Reed will help with Bingo and raffle prizes. Sigrid Plajer will create a block party banner and Sara Adams agreed to procure music.

Youth Leader Resignation: Pastor Dietmar reported that Torri Stark had submitted her resignation as Youth Leader as of August 18th and Council voted to accept the resignation and to thank her for her dedication to the position and to the youth of the church.

Children and Youth Ministries: Pastor Dietmar reported that Christian Education and Personnel updated the position description for Youth Leader, changing Kids Night Out and Teen

Group to once a quarter and changing the hours to 12 hours per week for 11 months. The position will be advertised noting that it can be divided into more than one position if no one can be found to take on the full responsibility. Council voted to approve the position description and the options for filling it.

"Quest: The Awakened Traveler" is the new worship series for July 30-September 10 (Kick-Off Sunday).

Communion August 6: Class of '24 will serve - Kim Burkhart, Randy Tanner, Josh Wenrich, and Allen Wetzel (captain).

Pastor Dietmar Vacation: Pastor Dietmar requested vacation for July 17-23 and Council unanimously approved the vacation. Rev. Darin Namminga will fill in on July 23rd and Rev. Amelia Price will provide pastoral care for the week.

PASTOR'S REPORT JUNE 2023

Our St. Paul's Mission is to grow in faith, to worship God, to serve others, and to welcome all.

We explored the need for an associate pastor with the executive team of Church Council (President, VP, and Secretary), the Pastoral Relations Team, and the Personnel Committee in a meeting on June 11. This leadership team decided that we need an associate pastor:

- to implement our strategic plan which outlines many new ministry opportunities (see articles in our June/July newsletter),
- to grow and thrive as a congregation,
- and to provide leadership for ministries which are beyond what volunteer leaders can accomplish. Church Council discussed and supported the cause unanimously. We need additional funding to pay for an associate pastor.

We invite all from the congregation to ask questions and to provide input. The next steps in the process will be to establish a search committee. Stay tuned for more information.

Finally, our Visitation Ministry will be back up and running with two new leaders. Pastor Mary Peterhaensel (a retired Lutheran pastor) will function as Visitation Ministry Pastor and Susan Bolig as Visitation Ministry Coordinator. They share the responsibilities that Pastor Penny Dollar fulfilled pre-pandemic.



The Visitation Ministry depends on people like you and me who are willing to "adopt" one of our members or friends who is homebound (semi-homebound) or residing in a care facility. Currently, we have 25 members of St. Paul's who are homebound or residing in a nursing home. We need a few more volunteers who are willing to visit.

With great sadness we received notice that regretfully our Youth Leader, Torri Stark, will resign her position on August 18. It has become too much for Torri to work full-time at Susquehanna University and, in addition to that, as our Youth Leader. Torri has been a phenomenal Youth Leader. Her love and dedication to the children, youth, and families has been exemplary. She is an excellent educator who loves God and teaches joyfully. We will miss Torri much. It will be extremely hard to find a new Youth Leader who will serve like Torri.

The musical contributions for our summer worship services have been extraordinary in quality and variety. I am deeply grateful to all who share their time and talents in ministry. A great thank you goes to Joanne Lauer who coordinates and schedules our musicians. She does an outstanding job!

Together with Randy Tanner I participated in the UCC Penn Central Conference Annual Meeting on June 9 and 10 via Zoom with the theme "Renewing the Covenant." The meeting focused on how



we are together in ministry.

I'm planning for a summer worship series, "Quest: The Awakened Traveler" together with the worship team. The focus will be on how traveling opens us up to new experiences and new ways of growing in faith. Traveling does not need to be physical. We can go many places on an inner exploration.

Lois Ely passed away on June 7 and we celebrated her life with a service in our sanctuary on June 16. I officiated a service for Velvet Frazetto (Jackie Naugle's daughter) on June 10. Jack Riegel passed away on June 27. Our Card and Care Ministry team continues to lift up in prayer families like these and assures them and many others of God's presence.

Thank you for your prayers, your witness, your giving, your service, and your faithfulness to God and to God's work through St. Paul's. I see God at work in and through you!
