


OUR MISSION IS TO GROW IN FAITH, TO WORSHIP GOD, TO SERVE OTHERS, AND TO WELCOME ALL.

ST. PAUL'S COUNCIL MEETING NOVEMBER 8, 2022

In Attendance: Pastor Dietmar Plajer, Peggy Peeler, Sara Adams, Sigrid Plajer as guest, Allen Wetzel, Josh Wenrich, Randy Tanner, Linda Turner, Bev Heinemann, Kathy Ulrich, Shane Sanders.

Excused: Michael Zettlemoyer, Bob Engel, Amy Caron, Kim Burkhart.

Minutes of October Meeting: A motion was made by Allen Wetzel, seconded by Bev Heinemann, and approved by Council to accept the minutes as submitted.

Financial Report: The Financial Report was reviewed by Linda Turner. Of note was a \$2,000 donation to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. We had net income for October of \$2,011.96. A motion was made by Bev Heinemann, seconded by Linda Turner, and approved by Council, to accept the Financial Report.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dietmar highlighted items from his report, including the Hybrid Hope workshop he attended in October, our Stewardship program, and our children & family ministries. His complete report is reported each month in the Newsletter.

Stewardship: Stewardship Sunday is November 13th. Pastor Dietmar asked for feedback on the brochure that was sent out and related that it did not include our visitation ministry as, currently, we do not have a Visitation Ministry Coordinator. There was discussion and agreement regarding the need to show a line item on our budget for Benevolence.

Communion: Servers for communion December 4th will be the Class of 2024 – Kim Burkhart, Randy Tanner, Josh Wenrich, and Allen Wetzel, with the need for a 5th person. There are two services on Christmas Eve, 4pm and 7pm, and all Council members will be needed to serve. It was suggested that we involve the youth (teenagers) for the 4pm service.

Messy Church: There are approximately 45 people signed up for Messy Church on November 13th. Volunteers are always welcome and they should be at the church at 3pm to help set up and be assigned to an activity.

Video Upgrade: Equipment is on order and there is a possibility the upgrade may take place prior to Christmas.

PFLAG: There have been two meetings held so far. Randy Tanner recently attended a seminar at Bloomsburg University and

will be trained to become a facilitator.

Kids Night Out: Bev Heinemann volunteered in the pre-K room at the November 5th KNO and said everything went well. The next KNO is December 3rd.

Church Safety Plan: Linda Turner needs Council members to provide feedback to the draft plan sent out in October. She will work with Randy Tanner to collect necessary information to complete the plan.

St. Paul's Vision: Carrie Call will be at Council's December meeting to provide information on the process for developing an updated vision for St. Paul's.

Adult Sunday School: The focus of Adult Sunday School is Mature Faith and continues to go well. New attendees are always welcome.

Visitation Ministry Coordinator: Position remains open. Pastor Dietmar discussed avenues to explore to fill this position. Council Members: We continue to recruit candidates to fill open positions on Council.

Christmas Eve Offering: A decision was made to, again this year, donate our Christmas Eve offering to service organizations. This year we will donate 50% to Haven Ministries and 50% to REC.

Pastor Vacation Days: Pastor Dietmar requested November 22, 23, 29, and 30 as vacation days. A motion was made by Linda Turner, seconded by Josh Wenrich, and approved by Council, to approve the vacation.

Bridal Shop: We received a letter from the bridal shop asking if we would consider continuing to lease the property, after the owner's retirement and beginning in July 2023, to one of the employees interested in purchasing the business. The Finance Committee agreed this was a Council decision and Marv Rudnitsky emailed information on what needed to be considered. There was concern regarding liability to the church and whether or not we wanted to continue to act as landlord. Linda Turner agreed to get in touch with Marv Rudnitsky regarding those concerns.

Personnel: Bev Heinemann reported that a Bell Choir Director had been hired, Marie Dignam who is also our Joyful Noise Director, and rehearsals will begin November 9th. The Treasurer position remains open. A policy for clearances for volunteers working with children is now in place and Torri Stark will be responsible for ensuring necessary clearances are completed. 2023 Mission Budget: The proposed budget was reviewed with one correction required. The titles of the two Media positions

need to be corrected. Linda Turner will pass this on to Bill Hockenbrock. After review, a motion was made by Josh Wenrich, seconded by Randy Tanner, and approved by Council to accept the budget for 2023.

Finance Other: UCC Funds offers on-line access to our investment accounts and, with access, we'll be able to run reports when needed. Currently, since Donna Long left, only Bill Hockenbrock is authorized on this account. Finance recommended Bill Hockenbrock, Marv Rudnitsky, John Fischer, and Linda Turner be added to the account and also recommended that two people be required to authorize any transactions. A motion was made by Allen Wetzel, seconded by Randy Tanner, and approved by Council (1) to authorize these four people to have access and (2) to require two people to authorize any transactions on the account. **Property & Grounds, Other:** No updates on open items as the committee has not met recently. Allen Wetzel reported that he requested an updated proposal from S.J. Eaton for the boiler repair/replacement.

Right Relations: Shane Sanders asked about removing the chairs put up for the Chair Project. The chairs have been there for 2 months and one is beginning to deteriorate. All agreed that they can be removed. Hot Topics will begin at a yet-to-be-determined date in 2023.

Next Council Meeting: December 13, 2022 - in person and Zoom.

Devotions for next Meeting: Randy Tanner.

The meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.

PASTOR'S REPORT OCTOBER 2022

Our St. Paul's Mission is to grow in faith, to worship God, to serve others, and to welcome all.

I participated in a "Hybrid Hope" daylong workshop in Lancaster on October 1. Three things stood out: How important a clear vision is for our congregation, how to expand our online presence and ministries, always with excellence in mind, and how to encourage people to become sustaining members through online giving.

We continue our "Practice Your Faith" worship series. It shows us how we can move closer to God and experience God's presence in our lives. I am deeply grateful to the Worship Team, the Children's Message presenters, the musicians, lectors, greeters, acolytes, ushers, and Tech Team for making our services deeply moving and meaningful.

I invested a tremendous amount of time and energy in our "Love is Giving – Giving is Loving" stewardship program. The Gospel in a nutshell is "For God so loved the world that God gave..." (John 3:16). God loves. God gives. It's who God is. It's who we are. Through our loving and giving we emulate God. Thank you to each one of you for loving by giving generously! Our children, youth, and family ministries are amazing: Kids Night Out, Messy Church, Teen Group, Joyful Noise Choir, and the Children's Sunday school are wonderful ways to grow in faith, hope, and love. I am deeply grateful for our Youth Leader, Torri Stark; the Messy Church Coordinator, Sigrid Plajer; and you, the great people who support these programs with your all.

I continue to care for and meet with people from the community to invite them to St. Paul's and to minister to them in times of crisis. I officiated the funeral for Eli Espinoza on October 22. I support our local PFLAG group and marched in the Halloween Parade with rainbow colors with a great group of people from St. Paul's and from the community.

Thank you to Randy Tanner for organizing a Habitat for Humanity workday on October 8. We had eight persons from St. Paul's help renovate a house in Sunbury for a deserving family, a single mother with three children, to live in dignity. It's wonderful to see how we can make a difference hands-on!

We insulated the ceiling in our foyer above the ceiling tiles by the sanctuary entrance on October 22, thanks to the initiative of Rick Campbell and the hard work of Mike Proger, Dan Namet, Joe Erdley, and Torri Stark. The Property and Grounds Team installed numbers to make each door identifiable for emergency services.

I am deeply grateful for all of you who serve on our ministry teams (committees). You are the hands, hearts, and feet of Jesus in action.

Thank you for your wonderful expression of gratitude on Oct. 30 for Pastor's Appreciation month. I was touched by the love, care, and support you expressed through your many cards and the reception following the worship service. You truly are the best!
