When and How Will St. Paul's Reopen?



Out of an abundance of caution and in order to protect St. Paul's members and friends, we are not rushing to reopen St. Paul's for Sunday worship services. We established a Safe Re-Entry Task Force which includes health care professionals, to help us determine when and under what circumstances it may be safe enough for people to return to worship in person. We will continue to live-stream our worship services. If you have questions and/or want to provide input, please call the church office. We will forward your info to the task force.

Pentecost - May 31, 10:00 am

Pentecost is the birthday of the church. On the first Pentecost Jesus' followers and friends were excited, ignited, and empowered through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The church will offer families resources and craft supplies for them to experience a meaningful and fun VBS that will help them grow in faith.

Loaves & Fishes Needs Summer Help

Our food outreach ministry, Loaves and Fishes, continues to provide food for local families in need through the summer months. We need healthy volunteers to help us pack grocery bags from 9-11 AM and to help place them in clients' cars from 12:30-2 PM on the following dates: **June 26, July 31 and August 28**. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we offer curbside pickup for clients and refrain from physical contact. Volunteers will receive gloves and need to wear face masks. If you are an at risk person or closely connected to one, please remain safe at home. Thank you for your help.

“Worry. Trust. Pray. Be Kind. Love - How To Face the Pandemic from a Faith Perspective”

We are together in this, facing the Covid-19 Pandemic as individuals and as a community. How are we facing the dangers and the challenges as people of faith? How do our faith and our Holy Scriptures inform us and speak to the reality?

It's okay to worry and to be afraid. It helps when you express your concerns and fears. Write them down or talk with a friend about them. Fear does not go away on its own. It wants to be looked at, felt, experienced, expressed, and after doing that, you can release it.

Remember the story of the disciples engulfed in a storm while Jesus was sleeping in the boat. They rush to Jesus yelling, “Help! Help! We are drowning!” They fear for their lives. The virus is scary. We are vulnerable. What if I or someone I love gets infected? It is so very real!

It's okay to worry and to be afraid, to express your anxiety and angst. Acknowledge it. Feel it. And shout it out to Jesus, for him to wake up in this storm. When you do that and release it, trusting that Jesus can deal with it, you can feel relieved.

Worries are like birds. They fly over your head. Your job is not to fight the birds, but to keep them from nesting in your hair.

Are you praying? Trusting God is at the root of prayer. When you pray, you open up to God and trust God. You open your heart and your hands to God. Wherever you are, in whatever state of mind, God is present. Nothing can separate you from the love of God. Nothing!

It's good to remind yourself of this reality. In the midst of chaos and challenges, God is present. In the midst of fear, God is present. In the midst of pain and suffering, God is present. Wherever you are, God is present! You can sit still, relax, breathe deeply and know that God is with you. Like your own breath, God's Spirit flows through you and calms you down.

Someone said that courage is fear that said its prayers. Courage is not the absence of fear, but facing reality together with God, in hope. With God there is always hope, in and through the darkness, in and through pain and fear, in and through worries and suffering. Even in death and dying, God is present to wrap you in love and to raise you

up to new life, just like God raised Jesus! That gives me hope.

What can we learn from Jesus? He trusted God. He wrestled with God. He felt all human emotions, including pain, suffering, grieving, and feeling lost, lonely, and abandoned. “Why did you forsake me,” why did you abandon me, were Jesus last words on the cross.

Where do we go from here? What can you do? Your pain and suffering is an invitation to compassion. Your loneliness is an invitation to relationship. Your worrying, is an invitation to care and to love. And love, as St. Paul said, is patient and kind. By being patient and kind, through caring and loving, we participate in God's healing presence in and among us. With God there is always hope!

I pray with St. Paul, “The peace of Christ which passes our understanding, may keep your hearts, minds, and souls deeply rooted in the love of God!”

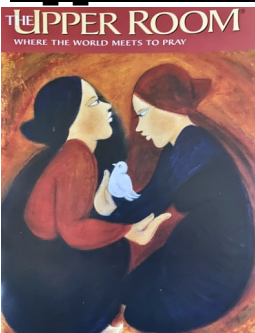

Church Council Meeting via Zoom - May 12, 2020

Pastor's Report: There is a lot going on. We are looking into providing capability for people to listen to the streaming service using their phones if they don't have access to the Internet. People are continuing with Zoom meetings. So many people are doing so many things, such as the scriptures, children's messages, and musical offerings. A lot happens in the background to make it possible. Sigrid Plajer is doing the slide shows and editing them. Sigrid and Jevan Beaver are doing the tech work for the services. We are very appreciative to Bill Hockenbrock and Marv Rudnitsky for applying for the CARES funding. Bill is doing all the financial input and reports himself, since Donna Long is not coming into the office to do so. Mike Proger has been caring for the property. Stacy Heinemann is doing things for the kids online. Allen Wetzel is mowing the lawn. Randy Tanner made a gift for Pastor Penny, who will be leaving for Virginia. Carolyn Fairl got flowers for Pastor Penny for Mother's Day. Pastor Dietmar is considering dropping the Wednesday night streaming services in June. He might do a five or ten minute message in the summer for Wednesdays.

Discussion Topics:

Live streaming worship services continue - Please provide feedback for these services. There were about 60 people who viewed the service online on Sunday as it streamed. We need to post on Facebook that the service will be coming. There are other people who might watch it after it is over, so there may be a lot more viewers.

Reopening St. Paul's for in-person worship - We have a task

force chaired by Stacy Heinemann and Joanne Lauer to address the re-opening of the in-person church services. Stacy gave a report on the Conference Zoom session with regard to opening up churches. It is not recommended to open until at least June. There would be no Nursery, Sunday School, Choir, no Kids Group. There are phases to go through when re-opening. Mary Dahlmann, Barbie Reed, and Beth Deckard will serve on the committee. We are waiting to hear from one more person to see if she will also serve on the committee.

Technology upgrade needed - In order to continue live streaming and in person presentations as we have had them before once we are back in church, there needs to be an update to our technology. The projected total would be \$21,407.34. We are working with the firm Illuminated Integration from Harrisburg for purchase and implementation.

The Stewardship and Finance Committee recommends that the Dianne Sheaffer bequest be used for the technology upgrades. A motion was made and seconded that the Sheaffer bequest be used for the purchase of the technology, and that Jevan Beaver be given the approval to sign the contract with the company who will be implementing this update. The motion was approved.

Estate of Dianne Sheaffer - We have received over \$213,000 from the estate of Dianne Sheaffer. We will need to look into how this money might be best utilized.

Joyful Noise Director search - This search continues. We don't know when the choir will be able to sing again in church.

Visitation Ministry Coordinator - We will table this until later, since we are unsure when the ministry will be able to be continued.

Wellness contact - People continue to reach out to the people in the congregation to make sure they are safe.

Worship plans for Pentecost Sunday - May 31st - There will be flames and coloring pages. We are asking people to color one piece of a large flame which will be put together in the sanctuary. This request will be present in the church email to the congregation.

We would like to have the Lord's Prayer recited in different languages.

Compensating employees from payroll program funds - A great thank you to Marv Rudnitsky and Bill Hockenbrock for helping us get funds through the CARES Act. This money will be used for salaries for those employed by St. Paul's who were affected by a reduction in salary due to the pandemic. If this money is not spent on salaries, we will have to pay back the money to the government. A motion was made and seconded to give John, our custodian, more work to do during this time. The motion was approved.

A motion was made and seconded to pay Carolyn Patton for playing Wednesdays for the online services. The motion was approved.

Change in office duties - We are going to add a job description for "Media, Technology, and Communications Coordinator". There was discussion about the position description and the number of hours being insufficient for all that must be accomplished. A motion was made and seconded to hire Sigrid Plajer as an interim tech person with the salary to be revisited in no more than three months. The motion was approved.

A motion was made and seconded to present Jevan Beaver with a Visa card to show our appreciation for all that he has done to get the online streaming established. The motion was approved.

Vacation Bible School plans - Youth Leader Stacy Heinemann is looking into online Bible School.

Other discussion topics - A motion was made and seconded to hold the summer services at 10:00 AM instead of 10:30. The motion was approved. There will be no Wednesday services throughout the summer. We will still have a Thursday discussion group. Different people could host this group. We could use this time as hot topic sessions.

Pastor's Report - April 15 - May 10, 2020

Our St. Paul's Mission is to grow spiritually, to worship God, to serve others, and to welcome all.

We continued to offer two weekly worship services online through the last month. The Sunday morning and Wednesday evening services have improved as our tech team upgraded equipment and software for the live streaming. Carolyn Patton and Jaime Namminga have been taking turns in playing the piano for the Sunday services while Carolyn continues to play on all Wednesday nights. It is wonderful to have people submit children's messages, music pieces, and scripture readings in video format, which Sigrid Plajer includes in our live stream services. It is more challenging for me to lead the worship services without the congregation present. I am sad and grieving the loss of our in-person ministries.

I invested much time and energy in keeping the congregation functioning under the challenging Covid-19 pandemic circumstances. Communication, planning, execution, and administration took more time and energy than I expected. Changes in the work of the church office are necessary. That has been weighing on me. I have been meeting with Personnel Committee and Council President to explore how we can improve the situation considering the needs of the church in the future.

We continue to send out our electronic St. Paul's eNews once or twice per week to keep the congregation and friends of St. Paul's informed and to invite them to participate in our ministries. St. Paul's ministries are vital and life changing. Our Loaves and Fishes food outreach ministry under the coordination of Randy Tanner has been life-saving for many local families in need.

I continue to care for members and friends of St. Paul's by sending caring cards, by calling, and via email and text messages. Together as a congregation we provide comfort to grieving persons, care for those who are sick and hurting, and hope and Good News to those who need it most.

We observed Mother's Day in Worship on May 10 with special music and a deeply moving "Tribute to Our Mothers" video that Jevan Beaver created in 2018. Also, we thanked Pastor Penny officially during this worship service for her years of faithful service as Visitation Ministry Coordinator, as supply pastor, as fill in pastor during my sabbatical, and as member of the Worship Committee. We will miss Pastor Penny very much. Pastor Penny moved to Richmond, Virginia, to live closer to her son.

Interim Media, Technology & Communications Coordinator



St. Paul’s Church Council Hired an Interim Media, Technology and Communications Coordinator - Since the beginning of this year, we have focused at St. Paul’s on updating computers, website, church management software, thinking about revamping the newsletter, etc. In addition, the onset of COVID19 has necessitated St. Paul’s UCC’s developing and adopting new programs and creative ways of worshipping together while social distancing and staying at home. Live streaming suddenly became a necessity and with that the switch to updated presentation software and a need for video editing. Sue Nentwig, our Office Manager, is not equipped to perform the expanded responsibilities that are required nor does she wish to do that. Instead of working 30 hours a week, Sue

will work 15 hours a week to accomplish her traditional office tasks. Therefore, our Personnel Committee in conjunction with Church Council has created the position of "Media, Technology, and Communications Coordinator" (MTCC) to perform and oversee all the technological, social media, website and live streaming work of the church and in addition produce a modernized newsletter and worship presentation slides. We determined that the person in this position must also possess the intangible attributes that are necessary to convey St. Paul’s vision, mission, ministries, and values. The MTCC must have the character, competence, and chemistry to work with our Tech Team and with our Pastor. It became very clear to all of us that Sigrid Plajer was the best person for this job. Sigrid has been doing most of these tasks on a volunteer basis for months and has an excellent working relationship with our Tech Team and our Pastor. She is willing to begin at the same hourly rate at which the Office Manager is being paid and bill the church for only 15 hours a week.
