- 5. We email twice per week to ALL who are interested "St. Paul's Good News." You can sign up for that through St. Paul's website. Scroll down and at the bottom right you sign up with your email address.
- 6. We share with families, children, youth, and seniors what they can do to grow in faith.
- 7. Pastor Dietmar meets on Thursdays at 7:00 PM, via Zoom with members and friends of the congregation. You can tune in through the link from St. Paul's Facebook page.
- 8. Church Council and church committees continue to meet electronically via Zoom.
- 9. Pastor Dietmar continues to officiate funerals (two in late March).
- 10. We continue our Card and Care Ministry, sending caring notes to those who are facing challenges.
- 11. Pastor Dietmar is always available to you. You can reach him by email: <u>dietmar@saintpauls-ucc.org</u> or call or text him at (570) 541-0121.
- St. Paul's ministries are vital and life sustaining during this crisis. More than ever we need a strong church with a clear message of hope. Council Summary - April 14, 2020

In Attendance - John Fischer, Joanne Lauer, Carolyn Fairl, Pastor Dietmar, Jack Lewis, Stacy Heinemann, Ellen Miller, Richard Campbell, Susan Bolig, Raven Rudnitsky, Lisa Krex, Bev Heinemann, Marty Blessing, Robert Engel, Ivana Lluveras.

Financial Report - John Fischer gave a financial report. John and Mary Rudnitsky are looking into the transfer details for the Louise Long fund. We need to look into the details with regard to usage of the funds. We have \$1,200 so far for the new tables for Fellowship Hall. Mary is looking into whether or not the Louise Long fund was transferred to another fund as requested. We need to see if we can use it for current usage. We need to look into the Diane Shaffer beguest to see what that entails. We owe Bill Hockenbrock a debt of gratitude for doing the treasury input since Donna Long is not coming in.

Pastor's Report - We are deeply grateful for the tech team who were able to get us up and running with streaming church services the day after school closed. We couldn't do what we are doing now without the new technology. We can also use our website very efficiently. It is important to offer the Wednesday service as well. We are exploring how to be a congregation in this new time. We need to try to connect with people at this time. We don't want to lose contact with people.

Discussion Topics:

• Help with online services -Volunteers are needed to read the scriptures or give the children's message either in church or from home. Contact Dietmar or the Worship Committee to volunteer to read the scriptures. Contact Lois Bruno if you are interested in doing a children's sermon.

- Ongoing services We will continue with Wednesday and Sunday services. The Thursday chats will continue, but not the Monday chats. We can look into giving the children ideas to do at home for Messy Church. Stacy Heinemann is doing things weekly with the kids online and following the Sunday School curriculum.
- What will the future look like We would like to be able to continue streaming when the church is open again, so that the sick and elderly can continue to attend the services online. We would also like to continue with our normal presentation for those in the sanctuary. A motion was made and approved to form a task force to look into what type of equipment would be needed to do both streaming and the regular presentation with the screens in the sanctuary.
- **Update on Staff** Cindy Martin, Sue Nentwig, and Pastor Dietmar will be compensated going forward, because they are still working. All other employees will be paid for the work they did prior to the closing. We are going to apply for the CARES Acts fund money for the Payroll Protection Act. Staff members, who are not getting paid at this point. may also be applying for unemployment compensation.

A discussion was had to employ our custodian John for two hours a week to make sure the church is not in need of immediate attention. A motion was made and approved to employ John for two hours a week.

Carolyn Patton will be offered a small compensation to help with her gas expenditures for the services she plays for each week. A motion was made and approved to offer her \$20.00 a week compensation for playing for the Wednesday night and Sunday services.

Allen and David Wetzel will be mowing the lawn during this time.

• Need for a Visitation Ministry

Coordinator - Pastor Penny leaves at the end of April. We need to find someone to replace her. Since no one can visit currently, this will not impact us immediately. We should continue contacting people in the church to see how they are doing.

• Suggestions for ongoing virtual ministry - We are going to list the birthdays and anniversaries in the eNews each week, since there are no bulletins at this time

Communication - Jamie Namminga won't be able to be our Joyful Noise director going forward. She has been promoted at Susquehanna University and will not have enough time to direct. We need to conduct a search to find a new director for the Joyful Noise Choir. We accept her resignation with regret.

Upcoming Dates - Look for information in the church emails.

Prayer Concerns - Gail Fischer's mother, Violet Remaley will be 97 on April 23rd. She is not doing as well as she could be. Cards would be appreciated.

Peggy Peeler's baby grand-daughter Cora is being tested for a tumor. Prayers for her are needed.

Rachel, a friend, is in ICU on a ventilator with the Covid virus and not doing well.

We are going to elicit Letters to Jesus from the children and anyone else who wishes to send one.

Pastor's Report - March 2020

Our St. Paul's mission is to grow spiritually, to worship God, to serve others and to welcome all. The Selinsgrove schools closed on Friday, March 13, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, and we had our first live stream running from St. Paul's sanctuary on Saturday, March 14, at 10:00 AM. That is an amazing accomplishment, made possible by Jevan Beaver and Sigrid Plajer, who started preparing for this on March 11 by researching what would be needed for keeping St. Paul's up and running to reach out electronically as a congregation.

Our Holy Scriptures and faith experiences speak clearly to our unsettling circumstances. We are called to be the church for such a time as this. Jesus calms the storm, Jesus rescues sinking Peter, God's Spirit breathes new life into a valley of dry bones, ... Jesus provides assurance and peace when we trust him, when we surrender to him. He promised to walk with us in and through the valley.

Since March 15 we have been offering two worship services per week, on Sundays at 10:30 AM and on Wednesdays at 7 PM. Carolyn Patton has been extravagantly generous in offering herself to play the piano for our Wednesday services. To prevent the spread of the new coronavirus, Church Council decided on March 17 to transition to online worship only.

Currently, we are sending out our electronic St. Paul's Good News twice per week to keep the congregation informed, grounded, and centered during these uncertain times.

I'm offering a casual meeting place to create community, a place to share thoughts, feelings, and experiences via Zoom on Monday and Thursday nights at 7 PM, which have been well received.

Church Council, Christian Education, and Stewardship and Finance meetings have been held electronically via Zoom.

Holy Week gave us special opportunities to include children, families, and individuals in our online worship services. The Waving of the Palm, the Scripture Readings, the Children's Messages, and the Special Music presentations have been outstanding.

Since we transitioned to online worship, several new people joined us in worship and appreciate our church's message of peace, faith, and hope.

The children and families from Messy Church, from Sunday school and Kid's Group helped color a magnificent butterfly, a symbol of Easter transformation and new life, which adorns the sanctuary.

Our Tech Team, Jevan Beaver and Sigrid Plajer (with the help of Felix Plajer), have implemented and are continuously improving the live streaming of our worship services. New equipment has been acquired, installed, tested, and is in use. Week by week we have seen improvements.

As Church Council and as a congregation we are trying to connect with all members and friends who are at risk of isolation.

We continue to offer our Loaves and Fishes food outreach ministry on March 27 with many new helpers and volunteers from our community. More than ever, Loaves and Fishes is vital for those in our community who need it most. Much time and energy went into making it an as-safe-aspossible event for volunteers and for clients. The drive-up and curbside pick-up distribution worked smoothly. Thanks to all who made this possible!

Church Council decided to transition to the email only distribution of our monthly Messenger newsletter to all those who have email. It will be mailed only to those who do not have electronic means to receive it. Our congregation has experienced a significant drop in income since we transitioned to online worship only. Our office manager works with re-

duced hours, about 15 hours/ week from previously about 30 hours, while our custodian is currently not working. Personnel, Finance, and Church Council are exploring how to proceed with the other employees considering the stay-at-home order from the PA Governor for all non-essential business, which went into effect on April 1.

The Selinsgrove Area Christian Council (SACC) Easter Food Distribution took place on April 3 and 4. I'm deeply grateful to all who donated food and dollars to SACC to make Easter for many families in need in our Selinsgrove area possible.

Marie Beard (96) passed away on March 10, and I officiated the funeral service for her on Saturday, March 21. Wayne Wetzel (83), the father of Allen Wetzel, died on March 18 and I officiated the service for Wayne on Saturday, March 28.

I am deeply grateful to all who continue to give generously to support St. Paul's mission and ministries and extend my heartfelt gratitude to all those who increase their giving to ensure the vital mission and ministries of our beloved St. Paul's continues.

Thank you for your prayers, your witness, your giving, your service, and your faithfulness to God and to St. Paul's. You are the hands and the heart of Jesus in action!
