# St. Paul's Council Meeting - October 12, 2021

Because of the timing of the newsletter publication, these newsletter minutes are not the official, approved minutes. After the minutes have been approved at the next meeting, the final minutes are available upon request.

**Minutes:** A motion was made by Marty Blessing and seconded by Bob Engel to approve the minutes from September 14th. The motion was approved.

**Financial Report:** Courtney Hanes reported, presenting the financial reports from September, which were sent to the council ahead of time. One note was that the proceeds from the Block Party were split between the children's choir and the REC center. Bob Engel motioned to accept the financial report as read, Peggy Peeler seconded, and the motion was approved.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Dietmar sent the report to the Council members ahead of time and started out with a reminder that we're still operating in a pandemic and in a hybrid model, and we're doing really well! A big thanks to everyone who made the block party such a success, as well as for the lovely Pastor Appreciation Sunday!

#### **Unfinished Business & New Business:**

- Worship Service Singing decision. Continue to follow CDC guidelines. Snyder County is still in the "high" category, so we will continue to follow CDC guidelines that include masking indoors. We will continue as we have been until the local situation (transmission rates, etc.) improves.
- Worship in person, via internet and by phone- How can we improve? Sigrid shared that on average, it's about 5 people who are calling in and listening to the service on the phone. Some people call in later in the week and listen to the recording. Sigrid was able to program the lighting panel, so we don't need to replace it! They are still exploring options for the TVs.
- Messy Church. On Oct. 10th they had 12 volunteers and 13 attendees, so it wasn't as well attended as normal. Everyone was masked the entire time, but because there

- weren't as many people, it didn't go as long. Everyone left with a goody bag. Hopefully, the November one will be better attended.
- Adult Sunday School classes Sunday AM w/Lois Bruno and Marty Blessing, Thursday Evening w/Raven Rudnitsky. The first Thursday evening group was held last Thursday evening with Barb Lewis facilitating. It was a very thought-provoking evening.
- Wednesday Kids Group & Sunday school. Linda Turner reported. There haven't been a bunch of students on Wednesday or Sunday morning, 3-5 kids, but it's been great. We do need more volunteers for the programs a volunteer doesn't need to volunteer all the time once a month or every other month would be great!
- Confirmation Group for the Fall: Pastor Dietmar reported that there are 5 in the confirmation group and they are exploring the concept of the soul. On the 24th, they will be participating in the worship, sharing some of what they've been doing. A big thanks again to Linda and Torri for being mentors!
- Kitchen Cupboard Emergency Food Pantry disbands.
   Community Action Agency (CAA) is taking over because they offer the same service and will continue to do so.
   Funds left over will most likely be distributed to other local food ministries. Those who contributed to that ministry will be recognized and thanked for their involvement.
- "Learning to Pray" Worship Series Planning for the Fall Program Year: Pastor Dietmar reported, thanking the Worship Committee for having everything set up (prayer cross, candles up front, prayer fence outside, prayer beads.
- Stewardship Program. Pastor Dietmar was very grateful
  for those who responded to his questions. Because we are
  in a good place financially, this will have more of a grateful
  ness campaign feel. We will need maybe one or two more
  speakers, as well as help with mailers.
- New Council members for 2022, keep at 15 or go to 12? A call was put out/into the eNews as well. No one has asked about being involved, so the Council started making a list of people and will ask people directly. We are looking for 4 new people. It was also proposed that people can commit to only one year and stay on longer if they want to. Marty proposed that we also offer to make sure that they know we can do hybrid meetings, so they would not have to go out in the evening.
- Pastor Dietmar Vacation days October 14, 17, 21. Linda Turner motioned to approve the three requested days


- off, Michael Zettlemoyer seconded, and the motion was approved. Darin Namminga will lead worship and provide sermon for October 17.
- Green Team. Shane reported on the completion of the sheds project. The "Living into Right Relations" committee needs potential members, so Shane will send out some feeler emails - the committee would focus on a variety of issues connected to social justice, moving creation justice (Green Team), as well as future "Hot Topics" under its umbrella. - Personnel Committee. All new hires now have their clearances on file, and they are in a shared Google Drive. It would be nice to have a list of people who already have state clearances on file, just in case we need someone a lit-

- tle last minute. Ivana was approached about being the 2nd permanent nursery attendant but is not able to commit to that as she is starting a new job.
- Property and Grounds Committee. Rick Campbell reported. All roof work is finished, the basement island faucet needs to be replaced, and the bridal shop needs to have some of the exterior wood trim painted. No change to concrete work, window replacement, or boiler replacement.

# Pastor's Report - September 2021

Our St. Paul's Mission is to grow in faith, to worship God, to serve others, and to welcome all.

The Worship Team has been terrific in planning for our new worship series about "Learning to Pray." The purpose of this series is to help us explore why we pray and how to pray and to practice personal and communal prayer. The worship team is planning four ways to make this series meaningful and engaging for the friends and members of St. Paul's: A candle installation on the communion table (altar) for people to light candles during the service, a prayer cross for people to attach their personal prayers to in the back of the sanctuary, an outside prayer ribbon installation for the community to join us in this season of prayer, and prayer beads with individual beads reflecting the theme for each Sunday beginning with Back to Church Sunday, Sept. 12. I am grateful to all on the worship team for creating engaging, meaningful, and moving worship services.

A Picnic and Pool Party for all friends and members of St. Paul's was held at the Rudnitsky residence in the afternoon of August 8. It was a delight to see so many join us for a time of fun, food, and fellowship, reconnecting with each other in person after a long pandemic season. It feels great to be together in person. I am very grateful to the Rudnitsky family for hosting this event and for all who

made it a great experience.

The Christian Education and Music Teams have been planning for our "Back to Church" fall season with Sunday school for children and adults. Kids Group, Senior Choir, and Joyful Noise Choir to resume their ministries. These teams together with the Personnel Committee interviewed Torri Stark and hired her as new Youth Leader. Torri Stark is amazing, trained as a teacher with 8+ years of experience as director in children and youth ministry at her previous church. I am excited to have her as new Youth Leader serving at St. Paul's. I am planning for teaching a Confirmation Class this fall through June 2022. The Music Committee interviewed Julie Long and Adam Dietz and Council hired them as Joyful Noise Choir Director and Senior Choir Accompanist respectively.
